Thank you for sharing with me your letter to the Seattle Parks Department regarding efforts by the I-5 Trails Coalition, Urban Sparks, and the Backcountry Bicycle Trails Club to develop I-5 open space as a recreational area featuring an urban mountain bike trail. This is a truly exciting proposal that has the potential to offer great recreational benefits community wide. I hope and trust that the City will lend the cooperation and support that this effort deserves.

It is rewarding to see the collective knowledge and collaborative spirit the Trails Coalition and other stakeholder groups are bringing to this project. Preserving public open space in the manner you envision is creative, and is very much in keeping with the City's short- and long-term urban development goals.
